**'STORIES FROM THE
FIREGROUND' BOOK
WINS NATIONAL AWARD**

The Shire of Harvey produced book "Stories from the Fireground" has been awarded the Special Judges Award at the EMPA Emergency Communication Awards which were announced at a conference in Melbourne on the 4th June 2018. The Annual EMPA Awards for Excellence have been established to recognise those who have made a significant contribution to emergency communications in Australia and New Zealand. Emergency Media & Public Affairs (EMPA) is the only representative organisation of emergency service and disaster communications practitioners in the world. This book contains stories, poems, photos & drawings from people across the Shires of Harvey and Waroona who were impacted by the Waroona, Yarloop and Harvey January 2016 Bushfires.

Harvey Shire President Tania Jackson accepted the award on behalf of the Community, at the Western Australian EMPA Conference held in Perth on Thursday 7th June. Cr Jackson accepted the award from Anne Leadbeater OAM who said that it was a truly outstanding publication that really stood out amongst the other nominations. EMPA chief Executive Officer Peter Rekens said the book struck a chord with the judges who felt that it deserved the judge's award. "The book is so beautifully done and it shows respect for the stories it tells," he said. "It was the one that really

stood out for all of us; we were really moved by it."

"These stories reflect the trauma, show some of the history that has now been lost and tell of the heroic efforts of emergency services, farmers and individuals who helped to protect lives, homes, livestock and property. To have such a record is important and to tell our story was essential" stated Cr Jackson when accepting the award. We hope that others can learn from our experience.



**Curried
Cauliflower Soup****Ingredients**

1 tablespoon olive oil
1 medium brown onion, halved, chopped
1 garlic clove, crushed
80ml (1/3 cup) mild curry paste
1.5kg cauliflower, trimmed, coarsely chopped
1L (4 cups) vegetable liquid stock
500ml (2 cups) cold water
250ml (1 cup) coconut cream
2 tablespoons roughly chopped fresh continental
parsley leaves
Salt

Method**Step 1**

Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add onion and garlic and cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until onion softens. Add curry paste and cook, stirring, for 1 minute or until fragrant.

Step 2

Add the cauliflower, stock and water and bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer, stirring occasionally, for 15 minutes or until the cauliflower is tender. Set aside for 5 minutes to cool.

Step 3

Transfer half the cauliflower mixture to a clean saucepan. Blend or process the remaining cauliflower mixture, in batches, until smooth. Add to saucepan with unblended cauliflower mixture.

Step 4

Add coconut cream and stir over medium heat for 5 minutes. Remove from heat, stir in parsley and season with salt.

Thank you to Janine who donated a sewing machine and overlocker for members to use. They will come in very handy when we have sewing busy bees. Lots of other people – too numerous to mention here – have donated much needed supplies and sets of equipment which will all be utilised in the near future. We appreciate these kind gestures very much and it will help us to deliver our services more easily. We have some nice chairs and meeting tables ordered and also a table that can be lowered

and raised according to your individual height, making it more comfortable to work whilst standing.

Another important event on the CWA Calendar is the Annual State CWA Conference in Fremantle in July. Two delegates and two observers from Yarloop will be attending and there looks like some interesting motions being presented for discussion. One motion is to select an organisation to fundraise for during the next 12 months – either the Breast Cancer Foundation or the Alzheimers Association. Other motions put forward for discussion include whether CWA of WA can influence the State Government in its decision to cut funding to CRC's and community kindergartens with less than 16 children enrolled in 2019, requesting the Federal Government to amend the list of GST exempt health goods to include sanitary pads and tampons, reconsidering the rise in cost of VacSwim classes and urging the Federal Government to change the Medicare rules when multiple medical imaging tests are required – these being able to be completed in the one day and still receiving the full Medicare rebate.

We will try and report on the outcome of the motions and whether they were supported in future news. Until next month, fingers crossed for some fine days to finish our landscaping.



BANNERS ON THE TERRACE COMPETITION

The Banners on the Terrace was a wonderful opportunity for our Yarloop school and community to be represented and portray our sense of strength and push towards the future.

Since having 48 students in 2015 prior to the devastation of the Waroona bushfires, to 36 students in 2016, Yarloop Primary School returned to their grounds in 2017 with 40 students and are now proud to have 43 students in 2018, with the prospect and growth of the community continuing to grow.

Therefore, the design was chosen to signify our towns tragedy in January 2016 and more importantly how our town has come together and continued to grow and prosper.

The fingerprints that make up the tree are from students, staff and families at our school, with families asked to do their fingerprints first as they are the foundation of our community. The colours black, red, orange, yellow, light green and dark green were selected to show the progression since the Waroona bushfire in January 2016 through to our new growth in 2018.

Notice to Private Pool Owners

In Western Australia, the design, construction and installation of private swimming and spa pools and their safety barriers is subject to strict building requirements under the Building Regulations 2012 (the Regulations). Owners and occupiers also have ongoing legal obligations to maintain their safety barriers at all times.

Council's Building Department will be commencing its swimming pool inspection programme for 2018 from 2nd July 2018.

Staff will be visiting property owners that have private swimming pools and outdoor spas over the coming months, as part of its rolling four year inspection programme. On 1st May 2016 the Regulations relating to private swimming and spa pools changed so owners are encouraged to check the operation of self-closing gates and latches and ensure fencing remains secure and non-scalable.
