YARLOOP COMMUNITY CENTRE REBUILD HAS FINALLY KICKED OFF

As of the 15th of October, site works for the Yarloop Community Centre have finally started! Another huge milestone for the community, to see one more building starting to go up in town.

After a lot of planning, waiting and evaluating tender applications, the job was given to CivilCon Construction who are familiar with builds that require integrating a historic structure with a new building. After the Yarloop Fire, all that stood from the old town hall was the brick façade and as a town, we are very lucky to be able to keep part of such a historic landmark in the rebuild.

Earlier in September, Harvey Shire President Tania Jackson was joined by Yarloop CRC manager Julie-Ann

McMiles, Yarloop Town Development working group member David Harvey, Murray-Wellington MLA Robyn Clarke, Harvey Shire acting Chief Executive Officer Shane Collins, and Civilcon general manager Jake Bocchetti for the turning of the soil at the old Yarloop Hall site.

No word yet on how long the building will take to be completed but it is finally all coming together. CRC staff (who are to be the anchor tenants of the new building) are looking forward to bringing life to the Centre and put it to good use.

After waiting so long, it'll be up before we know it.

SWOOPING SEASON

Magpies defend their nesting territory by attacking people or animals. Because they hesitate to attack if they think they are being watched, they usually swoop from behind. The mating season can vary from state to state but generally is between late August to late October, with the occasional borderline case.

Last year, we saw 14 cases of bird eye injuries in July and 12 in August. However scary these birds can be, it doesn't have to keep you from enjoying your regular walk or bike ride.

These safety tips will hopefully help you get through the rest of swooping season without injury:

- Try a different route
- Protect your head and eyes
- Wear a hat or carry an open umbrella
- If a magpie is swooping, stay calm and move quickly (but don't run)
- If you do get attacked log the location on magpiealert.com so others can avoid it

Please note that it is an offence to kill, injure, move or keep these birds unless authorised by permit.

ARCHITECT APPOINTMENT – YARLOOP WORKSHOPS CONCEPT PLAN

The Shire of Harvey has appointed Gresley Abbas Architects to produce a Concept Plan for the proposed redevelopment of the Yarloop Workshops site in Yarloop.

This site is the major and most complicated site that was impacted by the January 2016 fire which destroyed 166 buildings in the town and left very little remaining of the mostly timber structures at the Workshops.

Shire President Cr Jackson stated in relation to the appointment –

“Council is at the commencement of perhaps a five year project with this site redevelopment. While it is acknowledged that the structures lost cannot be replaced as they were, we are committed to redeveloping the site in a manner sympathetic to the past but in a manner that is both interesting and interactive”.

“We believe that Architects Gresley Abbas have the capacity, experience and motivation to see this site become one of the major visitation drawcards in the South

West once again, albeit the experience will be different from days gone by”.

Some of the items salvaged from the fire that can be restored include 3 locomotives, which will remain as real life representations of the era past. The Steam workshops section of the site remains insitu and will be a feature attraction of the redevelopment.

The Shire encourages local residents to have input and put forward their ideas for the redevelopment of the Yarloop Workshops site. Further information on consultation for the Workshops and other ways of having input will shortly be provided.

The Concept Plan for the redevelopment of the Yarloop Workshops is expected to be completed by early 2019.
